as amended by Pleasure Grounds Public Walks
and Open Spaces Byelaws made on 15 February 2000
and confirmed on 27 March 2000

BYELAWS

made by the District Council of Dover under Section 164 of the Public Health Act 1875, Section 15 of the Open Spaces Act 1906 and Sections 12 and 15 of the Open Spaces Act 1906 with respect to the open spaces and pleasure grounds vested in or maintained by the District Council of Dover.

1. Throughout these byelaws the expression "the Council" means the District Council of Dover and "the pleasure ground" means, except where inconsistent with the text, each of the grounds and open spaces named in the First Schedule to these byelaws.
2. An act necessary to the proper execution of his duty in the pleasure ground by an Officer of the Council, or by any person or servant of any person employed by the Council, shall not be deemed an offence against these byelaws.
11. A person shall not cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the pleasure ground, unless such dog be and continue to be under property control, and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person, and from worrying or disturbing any animal or waterfowl, and from entering any ornamental water.
Provided that in any area in the pleasure ground maintained as ornamental gardens or flower beds or a children's playground which shall be indicated by a notice as being an area where dogs must be kept on a lead, a dog shall not be deemed to be under proper control unless it is on a lead.
20. Every person who shall offend against any of these byelaws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds.
21. Every person who shall infringe any byelaw for the regulation of the pleasure ground may be removed therefrom by any officer of the Council, or by any constable, in any one of the several cases hereinafter specified:
that is to say –
 - (i) where the infraction of the byelaw is committed within the view of such officer or constable, and the name and residence of the person infringing the byelaw are unknown to and cannot be readily ascertained by such officer or constable;
 - (ii) where the infraction of the byelaw is committed within the view of such officer or constable, and, from the nature of such infraction, or from any other fact or which such officer or constable may have knowledge, or of which he may be credibly informed, there may be reasonable ground for belief that the continuance in the pleasure ground for belief that the continuance in the pleasure ground of the person infringing the byelaw may result in another infraction of a byelaw, or that the removal of such person from the pleasure ground is otherwise necessary as a security for the proper use and regulation thereof.
